STARTING A COLLEGE TRANSCRIPT IN HIGH SCHOOL

DUAL ENROLLMENT

- You are enrolled in the course at Horizon Honors and enrolled through a College at the same time
- Two grades – an Honors Level grade on your HS transcript and a college course grade on your college transcript
- You pay the college tuition rate and pay for your books for the class

STARTING A COLLEGE TRANSCRIPT IN HIGH SCHOOL

AP – ADVANCED PLACEMENT

- A program in the United States and Canada, created by the College Board, offering college-level curricula and examinations to high school students
- American colleges and universities often grant advanced placement and/or course credit to students who obtain high scores on the examinations
- You are enrolled in the college level course at Horizon for Honors credit
- The AP exam is encouraged, but optional – HS grade is separate from the exam score

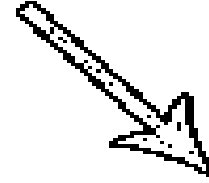
