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School Profile

Horizon Honors High School (HHHS) is part of the Horizon Community Learning Center (HCLC), in the Ahwatukee/Foothills area of Phoenix. Horizon students come from all areas of the valley. HCLC celebrated its 18th year of operation in July. HCLC is a tuition-free, public charter school providing continuous learning from kindergarten through high school. Of the 1550 students, 403 are members of the honors high school. Horizon is accredited by North Central Association and AdvancEd. HHHS exceeds all state standards placed on public schools including the areas of curriculum, student achievement, fiscal management and public accountability. The school provides a rigorous education for college bound students, **and is rated as an "A" by the AZ Department of Education**. Our High School was once again recognized by US News and World Report as a top high school in the nation. Our ranking in the state is #13 and we received a silver medal. Additionally, HHHS received *Americas Best High School* label from The Daily Beast.

FACULTY

The 2016-2017 HHHS Faculty is composed of 38 certified teachers, 2 counselors, 2 administrators, 2 special education teachers and 7 support staff. Among this faculty, 5% hold a doctoral degree, 85% hold masters degrees and 10% hold bachelors' degrees. All instructors are considered Highly Qualified under No Child Left Behind regulations, and six faculty members also teach community college classes. Teaching experience: 8% have 0-5 years, 34% have 5-10 years, 58% over 10 years. Horizon faculty is committed to developing a positive relationship with each student, which is made possible by small class sizes.

CLASS STRUCTURE-CURRICULUM

Horizon offers two semesters per year. Typical students attend 7 academic classes each semester. Most classes are scheduled in 90-minute blocks, meeting 2-3 times a week. Class sizes average 20 students per instructor. Honors classes are available in all departments. The rigorous college preparatory honors classes have higher expectations for work completion, more critical thinking elements and in-depth classroom discussions.
